Writing

Our English lessons will be based on the text Clockwork written by Philip Pullman.

The children will continue developing their spelling and use of punctuation as well as their sentence structure.


This term the main focus will be writing diaries, instructions, explanations and narratives.

PSHE

The theme of our PSHE lessons this term will be learning about Keeping Safe as well as Inclusion and Acceptance.

Maths

The children will be continuing with the Maths Mastery Scheme. Our topics for this term are as follows:

- Fractions, decimals and percentages and their equivalents
- Co-ordinates and position
- Multiplying and dividing fractions
- Decimals and measure

Children will continue to develop their arithmetic skills. Children can practise their times tables on Times Table Rock Stars.

Science

The children will be learning about Living Things and their Habitats as well as Adaptations.

This will include learning about

- What microorganisms are
- How microorganism can be good and bad for us
- How microorganisms spread
- How animals have adapted over time
- The causes of evolution



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History

Our key theme of the term is looking at 'How has the monarchy changed'. Our key questions for this term are:

- Why is William the Conqueror's invasion of England now not as being important as when it happened?
- How did the Magna Carta make England a fairer country?
- What did Henry VIII change which still remains today?

Art/Design and Technology

In art this term we will developing our painting and stencilling skills whilst learning about the Artist 'Banksy'.

In design technology we will be learning about nutrition and making 'Cakes and Bakes'.

In RE we will be learning about Islam including about the Qur'an. In French our theme is family.

Computing/Music

Geography

Physical Education
