### Reading

In our reading lessons we will studying a range of texts:

- War Horse by Michael Morpurgo
- A bridged version of Anne Frank's diary
- War time poems such as Flanders' Field

The focus is on developing an understanding of vocabulary, inferring information from the text and using evidence to support answers.

### Writing

Our English lessons will be based on the text War Horse. The children will write three longer pieces each term: a narrative and two non-fiction pieces. This term the children will be writing a story, a diary entry and a nonchronological report.

Each week the children will do lots of short burst writing activities to develop the key writing skills needed for the longer task. This term we will focus on using a range of punctuation, developing sentence structures and building a wide vocabulary.

#### **Educational Visit**

This term on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> September we will visiting Canterbury University who are collaborating with the NHS to provide workshops to help children understand the different type of roles that are available in the NHS.

# PSHE – 1 Decision

The theme of our PSHE lessons this term will be looking at our emotions and supporting children with staying safe online.

#### Maths – Maths Mastery

The children will be following the Maths Mastery Scheme. Our first topics for the term will be:

- Place value and number including rounding and decimals
- Multiplication and Division
- Calculation problems

#### Science - PZAZ

We topic this term is Animals including Humans. This will involve learning about:
